I te wiki tuawhā i haere mātou ki te wāhi
Orokonui. I kite mātou i ngā manu kākā.
He ataahua ēnei manu me te hoihoi hoki.



Titiro ki te mahi o ngā tamariki. I kimi rātou i
ngā ngangara, kei roto i te waipuna iti. I kii mai
a Whaea Tahu, 'living organisms'. I te
whāakaaro ā mātou tamariki kāore ngā mea e
noho ana ki te wai, engari anei ētahi o ngā mea
i kimihia e rātou. I mahi rātou i tētahi kōata
whakarahi (magnifying glass) kia kite ai i ēnei.



TE KURA POUTAMA

I timata rātou ā rātou aronga ki ngā kaupapa ako. I tēnei wāhanga ko te whakatika o te reo te kaupapa nui, arā i kaha ū rātou ki te taua mahi. I timata a Maia rātou ko Tūmai, ko Rawiri i te mahi pāngarau ki te taha o Te Wharekura o Arowhenua mā te hononga a ipurangi.

1.4 Ko te ngākau te mata me te kuaha o te wairua. Otirā, ko te whiu o te kupu, ko te wero, ko te riri, ko te aroha, ko te hūmārire, me ēnei āhuatanga katoa he mea kuhu ki te ngakau titi tonu ki te wairua. Koia nei te tīmatanga o te kōrero 'kia ngākau mahaki'. Mā tēnei hoki ka tika te kōrero 'He oranga ngākau he pikinga waiora.

1.4 In brief his statement from Te Aho Matua reminds us that our words, feelings, responses and challenges are all part of how we see ourselves.
